Further actions to help effect positive change

1. **Culture** - Understand and be respectful of cultural differences and beliefs; belonging and sense of identity; cultural safety
2. **Family Violence (FV)** - Continue working to promote Family Violence issues; Promote 'It's not OK' FV campaign.
3. **Strengthening Families** - Strengthening families coordinator based in Aranui
4. **Early childhood support** -- kids start school prepared; Strengthen and maintain relationships with early childhood services
5. **Youth** - Educate key youth workers about anger/shame issues and approaches on how to deal with it
6. **Deliver courses in Aranui** - Strengthen relationships with schools in Aranui; Bring together Adult educators to increase collaboration; look towards programmes that deliver marketable skills/qualifications and vocational skills; study/supporter buddies
7. **Building confidence in schools by local community** - Strengthening relationships with local schools
8. **Further development with existing services** - Collaboration; building/strengthening
9. **Keep upgrading physical environment projects** - Wainoni Park 10yr plan developed and completed; Vacant land developed and used for such things as community gardens; Tree planting; Lighting
10. **Development of existing buildings** - Upgrade and facelift Hampshire St shops
11. **Housing** - Strengthen relationship with HNZN; Community Housing initiatives
12. **Sport and Recreation** - CCC facilities; Wainoni Aranui Family Centre; Boxing and other positive sport and leisure activities; Grow summer/winter sport
